The beautiful and historic building has been very carefully and tastefully restored and the overall impression is of light and space and welcome.

Victorian Interfaith Network Conference 2013

The conference opened with a Welcome to Country by Wurundjeri elder Uncle Bill Nicholson and an indigenous dance performance. This was followed by a keynote address "Recognising Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples in the Constitution" delivered by Alistair McRae, immediate past national

President of the Uniting Church. Uncle Bill Nicholson then presented a message stick to Rev McRae.

It was a colourful and joyous gathering. On arrival participants were treated to a display of the Turkish art of marbling, gingery Eritrean coffee in tiny cups, Eritrean hand painting and Sikh turbans in the colours of the rainbow expertly wound on to the head if you wished. There was an uplifting and moving Samoan choir in the middle of the afternoon and a Sikh performance to conclude the afternoon. Lunch included delicious vegetarian dishes from the Middle East, Africa (Eritrean pizza!), India and other countries.

The serious part of the conference was 5 workshops on a range of topics; Emergency Ministry, Media and Communications, Youth Spirituality, Successful Interfaith Programmes and How to (not) offend people of faith. Each workshop was presented twice and I elected to go to the Successful Programmes and Media & Communications workshops.
